

# Sports Premium Grant: Report to Parents 2016/17

## Overview of the school

### Rationale for SPG spending in 2016/17

Sports Premium Funding was first allocated to schools from April 2013 for the academic year 2013/14 and has continued to be funded including this year 2016/17. The grant must be used to enhance the provision of Sports and PE in the school across Years 1 - 6 to encourage participation in sports and helps pupils to develop a more healthier life style. We use this funding to impact on EYFS as well.

The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on PE and Sport but schools have the freedom in how they choose to do this. At White Meadows Primary Academy children receive at least 2 hours PE a week and there are many extra-curricular opportunities for them through our clubs and sports team across the year.

Our rationale at White Meadows is that this funding should be used in a fully inclusive manner, to benefit all children not just those that have a natural affinity for PE and Sport. We believe in the nurturing of talent but also in giving opportunities to all children so that those who may not normally develop an active lifestyle are more able to do so, especially disadvantaged children
